






EYFS - Ash

Welcome to Ash Class! We have had a fantastic week being in our new class. The children have been brilliant at learning the new routines such as coming in and hanging up their belongings, sitting in their carpet spaces, remembering where the toilet is and learning to share and play with their new friends. This week we have introduced the sounds m,a,s,d and t. The children have been really keen to practise their sounds and write them in their phonics book too. Thank you for also practising these at home too, this helps them to consolidate their learning. In Literacy we have been learning nursery rhymes and also read the story Ruby's Worry. The children have responded really well to this book and made links to some of the worries they may have had starting school. We have talked lots about sharing our feelings and making sure they talk to us if they feel worried about anything. In maths we have been singing lots of number songs, a particular favourite is '5 current buns'. In their provision the children have created portraits of themselves and built houses in the construction area. We are looking forward to next week already!




YEAR 1 - Maple

In Maths we have been looking at numbers to 10, with how to represent them in different ways.




YEAR 2 - Oak




