We have settled into school life fantastically!


The children have picked up the school routines and learning really well and we are all very proud of them and the progress they have made so far. We have been working on our sound knowledge, handwriting and maths skills.


YEAR 1 - Maple

Last week in Maples class the children were very busy learning about the differences between the UK and Antarctica, they looked at clothes that they would wear in hot and cold weather in Geography. In our English lessons we have been learning about Lost and Found, the children have had great fun re-enacting the story and hot seating as the different characters – we had some fantastic questions asked. In Maths we have started to learn to recognise numbers as words, and find one more than a number within 10. The children were very well behaved when we had an exciting disruption to our day on Monday this week! When we get back to school we will carry on with our hot write for Lost and Found, and we will be starting to learn about Autumn in Science.



YEAR 2 - Oak

Before our exciting adventure with the weather, we were busy painting our shoe boxes by creating our own shades and tints of blue to create a beautiful underwater backdrop for our dioramas. These boxes are safe and dry and will be ready and waiting for us when we return. In Maths we have been consolidating our understanding of place value thinking about how many tens and ones are represented in each number. We have also been learning to write numbers as words and learning the importance of spelling these names correctly. Our story of The Snail and The Whale is coming along nicely, we have been learning to use adjectives to add more detail to describe nouns and make our sentences more interesting. Please keep reading and learning this story while we are apart. When we are back together we will be looking at our Science topic which is all about animals and their habitats and our Geography topic which is all about the oceans and continents of the world. Well done to everyone being so brave and patient during this difficult time. We miss you all and can't wait to get back together.


Heelands Water Damage...

As you can see from these images, the flood damage has been extensive, and it will take time to restore our hall to a useable space. The heavy rain had gathered on our flat roof and caused leakage to the hall ceiling and floor. Our library was also affected.

Since Monday we have liaised with various contractors to fully understand the extent of the damage and to establish when the building will be safe for children to return.

The hall will be out of use for some time as it must be dried out and repairs carried out to the ceiling as well as a new hall floor. We have already been planning creative solutions to this and we will continue to ensure that every Heelands child is safe and has the same ambitious opportunities as they have always had.
